Approximately 620,000 soldiers died. The work of honoring the dead began right away all over the country, and several American towns claimed to be the birthplace of Memorial Day. Researchers traced the earliest annual commemoration to women who laid flowers on soldiers graves in the Civil War hospital town of Columbus Mississippi in April 1866. But historians have tried to raise awareness of freed slaves who decorated soldiers graves a year earlier. Historian David blight tried to raise awareness of freed slaves who decorated soldiers graves on May 1, 1865 in Charleston South Carolina at a former planters racetrack where Confederates held captured Union Soldiers during the last year of the war.

Legislative Update - June 2023

General Comments.

Default - yes? or no? We are watching an almost Shakespearean tragedy unfold from within the Beltway while the political actors play with the debt ceiling without resolving the budget issue Meanwhile, the people face disastrous consequences if a solution is not resolved soon affecting everyone. A Continuing Resolution will solve nothing.

However, being an incurable optimist, I am reprinting some of the high interest bills for your action. If you have any comments, please give me a call or send me an email.

Federal:

The Expanding America's National Cemetery Act (H.R.

1413), This is a significant piece of legislation protecting full uniformed services burial benefits introduced March 7 by Reps. Lisa McClain (R-Mich.) and Chrissy Houlahan (D-Pa.) is designed to preserve the option for full military honors now available at ANC and offers a long-term solution to Arlington National Cemetery (ANC) which would inevitably run out of room. It would authorize designating the next national cemetery location with equivalent honors to continue these benefits, rather than reducing eligibility at ANC.

Your action is urged to use the "Take Action" on the MOAA website to ask your Congressman to support this measure. If you submitted it last month but received no answer — **do it again!**

Major Richard Star Act. This act would **repeal this unfair offset**, allowing these disabled Veterans to receive both their retirement pay and their disability pay. This bill is being resubmitted with high hopes that it will pass as a stand alone measure or included in the 2024 NDAA.

Please use "Take Action" to encourage support. It was doing well during the last secession but failed in the end.

Military Spouse Hiring Act, (H.R. 1277), This is a bill to address the high rate of military spouse unemployment. This is a significant factor in active duty retention. Both of our Senators are co-sponsors while Rep. Jared Huffman is not - lets get him on board as well.

COLA - The current COLA trend is upwards at around 2%. While lower than the 2023 COLA, it's still positive.

State:

AB 46 Retired Pay Tax Exemption. We are waiting to see that happens after the latter part of May. This bill is currently in suspense in the Appropriations Committee and will be voted "up or out" by mid-May. If its "up", we will need everyone to contact their local Assembly-person or Senator Mike McGuire to support it when it comes to a vote.

12. That F-22 Raptor looks awfully close.


13. Oh God. Oh NO. OH S***!


"Pub Crawl"
