- The Brey Scholarship is limited to a maximum of <u>two</u> awarded scholarships per applicant.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS

The application period for COL William G. Brey Scholarships will open on January 1, 2025, and will close on March 15, 2025. Closing date is firm. Those eligible to apply for scholarship assistance are children, wards, and grandchildren, natural or adopted, of living or deceased officer, warrant officer, or auxiliary members of the Chapter. Sponsors must be participating members. Scholarship eligibility is limited to those pursuing undergraduate academic and professional certificate programs. Applications will not be accepted for support of graduate studies.

Our experience is that it can take some time for prospective applicants to gather all the required supporting documentation, then prepare and submit the completed application before the cutoff date. We therefore recommend that Chapter members advise eligible family members of scholarship availability and contact information early enough to give them sufficient reaction time.

Legislative Update FEBRUARY 2025

General Comments.

<u>Federal.</u> Although **NDAA 2025** is in a "must pass" situation, we are still operating under CR state and I feel we really wont know how thew numbers will play out until after 20 January. Therefore, we will continue with the list of legislative priorities.

Veterans Benefits Administration VBA Shortfall. Of vital importance to our veteran community is a VBA shortfall. Therefore, some pensions, caregiver support and survivor benefits may be affected

The Major Richard Star Act - Concurrent Receipt for Combat Injured Veterans: Two-thirds of Congress has supported this bill for the past two years, however, the House version does not include this bill in the NDAA. Back door information by some lawmakers and staffers is that it "costs too much", pointing to the projected cost of the Major Richard Star Act (\$6 billion over 10 years) as a reason it has not moved forward.

Military Housing and Barracks: Both the House and Senate NDAA include provisions to invest in deteriorating barracks, however, it does not "answer the mail" to more than partially solve the problem. Please ask your Senators and Congressmen to support full benefits

Military Pay. It appears that the NDAA in regards to pay raise will come up short. Let's see after the dust settles following the elections - say later next month after the new Administration starts to work.

Arlington National Cemetery (ANC): The Expanding America's National Cemetery Act of 2023, H.R. 1413, is not included in either version of the NDAA. The proposed eligibility reduction for ANC remains on hold in the federal rule-making process.

State.

Great News! There a bright light in the East! Once more, and for the umpteenth time, Assembly Member James Ramos et. al. introduced AB 53 recently which will exempt military retirement and SBP from state income taxes.

Governor Gavin Newsom has included a 2025 -26 state budget item proposal to grant uniformed retirees and their survivors a state exemption on

their military pensions thanks to the diligent work by Assembly Member James Ramos during the past three years working closely with the governor and his stall.


